Responsible Behaviour Curriculum



Children learn better when they know the boundaries and what is expected from them.

They also learn better when they are happy and feel safe.

The DfE have produced guidance asking all schools to have a 'behaviour curriculum.'

It is not enough to just specify how the children will walk around schools and when they will put their hands up.

We need to spend time improving children's sense of responsibility and community, so they feel their education has purpose and they can express themselves and ask for what they need.

Your child will learn about:

- executive functioning
- school culture
- positive relationships

What are classroom rules?

- This week your child will have worked with their class mates to create a set of classroom rules that they have all agreed to stick to.
- These rules will be based around classroom safety and getting the most out of the learning opportunities at school.



Your role in the rules

- Knowing these rules can help you to reinforce the expectations and values of the school, and foster a respectful and cooperative environment in the classroom.
- Sending your child to school is a social contract and so supporting the rules of the school is part of that.

What if you have a worry?

- If you have a worry or concern about anything that happens in school around rules and consequences, please speak to the teacher or another adult at school.
- Showing your child that you are not happy with school can be harmful as it can create anxiety about going to school for your child.
- School staff are there to help you and your family, so reach out with any queries.

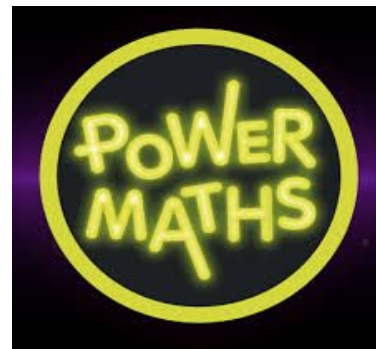
